

How to get from Hotel Sonáta to Hotelová Škola

Total distance is about 650 m (10 minutes walk)

Welcome party in Hotelová Škola

Thursday 19:00 - 21:00

All participants are expected to come to the conference venue: Hotelová škola, where the welcome party starts at 19:00. The distance from hotel Sonáta is about 650 meters, i.e. 10 minute walk – see the map on page 5.

Guided sightseeing around Mariánské Lázně

Friday 18:00 – 19:00

Guided sightseeing tour starts when Session IV is over (approximately at 18:00). We will learn a little about the history of this remarkable historical health resort and will have a possibility to taste from several curative springs.

Walking tour and dinner in Kladská

Saturday 16:00 - 21:00

Saturday dinner will be served at former hunting-lodge of prince Schnburg-Waldenburg. It is one of the most beautiful paces in region of Cheb with a pond in the centre of Protected landscape area Slavkov Forest. The participants will have two possibilities: either to walk from Marianské Lázně to Kladská (the distance is 8.5 km – see the map on page 7), or to take a bus to this place. Walking tour will start when the afternoon session finishes. Those going by bus are asked to announce their decision to Iva Krejčová. The bus will start at 17:15 from Hotelová škola, so that the participants will have enough time to make a walk on wooden paths around the pond (cca 2 km) before the dinner.

A return journey will be for all by bus.

Selection of main dishes (the choice is to be announced by Friday noon to Iva Krejčová):

- 1. Venison steak, potatoes (zvěřinový steak, vařený brambor)
- 2. Boar in rose hip sauce (kančí se šípkovou omáčkou, resti)
- 3. Wild duck, cabbage, Bohemian dumpling (divoká kachna, červené zelí, houskový knedlík)
- Hare joint in creme sauce, Bohemian dumplings (zaječí stehno se svíčkovou omáčkou, houskový knedlík)
- 5. Stuffed quails, mixed garnish (pečené křepelky s nádivkou, míchaná příloha)

Walking tour to Kladská

Total distance is about 8.5 km



Full day excursion

Sunday 10:00 - 18:00

The bus will leave at 10:00 from hotel Sonáta. First, we will visit a monastery in Teplá that was founded in 1193 by a Czech nobel man Hroznata. The monastery is famous especially because of its library, which is, with more than 100 000 folios, the second largest of this category in the Czech Republic.

After having a lunch (as a main dish a trout will be served) in a renovated small pension house (Gasthof Steidler) we will continue to Castle Loket with a Romanesque, 26m-high tower of a square ground, which along with the remnants of a living space conceals the Loket Dragon! The dragon bears a resemblance to a snake and a lizard, however, he is a real good soul. Up to the present the Loket housewives have been coming to him to get the fire for the kindling in their stoves. We will learn more about this castle during a guided tour in English.

The arrival to Prague (hotel Alton) is expected about (or slightly after) 18:00.
